

World AIDS Day Bike Ride is Saturday

The Los Angeles World AIDS Day Bike Ride will start at 8a.m., Saturday Dec. 1 at 6150 Wilshire Blvd.

The Los Angeles ride is the largest of all the events worldwide. Hundreds of cyclists wearing red (representing the Red Ribbon) will be cycling through the cities of Los Angeles, Beverly Hills, Brentwood, Santa Monica & West Hollywood for a 27 mile ride that represents the 27 years of the HIV/AIDS pandemic.

This year's ride will honor 3-year old Caleb Glover who, while on vacation with his foster parents, was asked not to use the swimming pool or the showers because he is HIV+.

World AIDS Day, observed Dec. 1 each year, is dedicated to raising awareness of the AIDS pandemic caused by the spread of HIV infection.
